We couldn't have made it without them, even to providing us with masks and rapid test kits to ensure our continued safety when they weren't readily available elsewhere."

## Overview of Programs

#### **Pathways to Education**

Since 2010, Chebucto Connections has delivered this award winning program to hundreds of students and has made significant progress in a number of key strategic priorities, including improving students' competencies and healthy living skills. Our goal is to make sure students are equipped to successfully transition to post-secondary education, training or employment; helping break the cycle of poverty. During the 2022-2023 school year, a total of 178 youth successfully completed the Pathways to Education Program, 90% of the students enrolled in Pathways graduated with 79% of those students transitioning to post-secondary education.

#### Oral Health Initiative

Thanks to funding from Green Shield and a collaboration with Spryfield Dentistry, we are able to offer oral care services to individuals who are under-insured or not insured. Maintaining good oral hygiene is crucial for both physical and mental well-being.

#### Library Club

Reading with your child fosters success by promoting knowledge and concentration. Chebucto Connections partners with the Dollywood Foundation to provide free books to children aged 0-5 through the Imagination Library, offering monthly deliveries of new books to children's homes for them to keep.

#### **Food Assistance**

With the increasing cost of living, food has emerged as one of the most requested essentials. Our initiatives aid local residents facing food insecurity free bi-weekly produce packs, a summer market, food pantry and holiday baskets. These initiatives supported 300+ households reaching 500+ individuals.

## Partnerships at the Hub

- To enhance service access, we collaborate with external organizations to provide additional services in our office. By offering internet, phone, printing, and faxing facilities, service providers can effectively assist residents in the Spryfield area.
  - Nova Scotia Legal Aid assists residents by offering free legal advice on tenancy/landlord issues, appeals related to income assistance, employment insurance, and CPP disability.
  - **Tax Filing** operates a year-round volunteer income tax program to help residents file their taxes, ensuring they receive benefits like the GST rebate and Child Tax Benefit.
  - Dalhousie Legal Aid runs a form-filling clinic where residents can receive assistance in completing applications such as citizenship papers.
  - The Multi-Service Round Table organizes monthly meetings for various service providers to gather, share their expertise, experiences, and resources, fostering awareness, enhancing communication, and preventing redundancy.
  - Getting Everyone Online (GEO) collaboration has facilitated equipping 13 households with digital skills, devices, and internet access.
  - Job Junction utilizes our premises to meet with clients and conduct workshops.
  - **Student Placements** offering students the chance to apply their academic knowledge and skills in a professional setting.
  - Saint Mary's International Master of Teaching English offers free English as an Additional Language (EAL) classes to community members.







Expenses for fiscal year \$1.104 Million

Throughout the fiscal year 2023-2024, Chebucto Connections has been supported financially by grants, foundations, businesses, and individual donors. Private donations have been essential in enabling us to allocate resources to initiatives that go beyond the scope of our grants, like the Holiday Basket Giveaway and Library Club. Our goal is to maintain a balanced budget while providing high-quality programs to our community. The net loss experienced this fiscal year reflects the increasing needs of the community we serve diligently. To aid in supporting and advancing Chebucto Connections' mission and vision, our board members and volunteers have established a fundraising committee with a focus on raising unrestricted funds.
